YEAR OF MERCY - LENTEN JOURNEY – WEEK 3 Scripture for the week:

My sacrifice, O God, is a contrite spirit; a heart contrite and humbled, O God, you will not spurn. Psalm 51:19

Reflection:

We begin Lent with really good intentions by making resolutions. If those resolutions have fallen by the wayside, we may be feeling badly because we all want to be faithful in following Christ on our Lenten journey. Perhaps we come to near the middle of Lent with the feeling that we have empty hands.

Have we done everything perfectly that we set out to do? Perhaps not

Have we been as kind and merciful as we intended to be? Again, maybe not.

Have we appreciated our own soul and the souls of our neighbours as God calls us to? Sadly not.

Have we been faithful to quiet time for prayer that we may hear the voice of God within us? Not really. So busy! God tells us not to worry and holds out his hand to our discouraged and humble hearts

A Time to Pause:

Let us take a moment to renew our intention to be instruments of God's Love and Mercy in our world this Lent. Weak though our efforts may be, they are precious in the sight of God. Let us rely on God who enlightens our hearts and gives joy to our spirit. Like the apostles, let us recognize the risen Christ among us and let our hearts be filled with Joy in the wonder of the Lord's presence within us.
