Softening the Heart

In today's Gospel, Jesus promises the Samaritan woman "living water which shall become a fountain within her, leaping up to provide eternal life"

The Responsorial Psalm 95 refers both to the "Rock of our salvation" and to hardened hearts. On the one hand, there is the Rock from which the water of eternal life flows (God). On the other hand, there are rocks (our hearts) which we seek to soften in Lent by "prayer, fasting and works of mercy."

Our goal is to "harden not our hearts:" to be concerned for the poor and suffering, to forgive the criminal, to welcome the stranger, to love our enemies.

"If only you recognized God's gift. ..."

By becoming for people, a model of merciful love for others, Christ proclaims by His actions even more than by His words that call to mercy which is one of the essential elements of the gospel ethos.

In this instance it is not just a case of fulfilling a commandment or an obligation of an ethical nature: it is also a case of satisfying a condition of major importance for God to reveal himself in His mercy to man: "The merciful ... shall obtain mercy."

### And Now, A Word from Our Pastor

We hold in prayer those who suffer with the corona virus and those who care for them. We continue to ask the Spirit of God to give wisdom to researchers in their development of a vaccine.

To respond to the situation and to concerns, Cardinal Collins has asked:

- That we all maintain good hygiene practices with hand washing/sanitizing and coughing/sneezing
- That we discontinue the distribution of the Eucharist from the chalice for the time being
- That we greet one another with a simple "Peace be with you" rather than shaking hands in the Liturgy
- That if we are ill, we stay at home rather than come to church.

In charity for others' concerns and welfare, I ask that we receive Holy Communion in our hands rather than mouths or tongues.
